Discussion Items:

1. Adding Items to the Collection:

Bib/Item record creation

Minimum entries for brief bib records shall be determined by MHLS cataloging

Item record

Required fields:

I-type

Annual Report

Barcode

Location

Cost

Entered By

Volume: The use of the volume filled in the item record shall be limited to multi-volume works (e.g. encyclopedias), serials or multiple editions (such as travel guides) that share the same bibliographic record. This field should not be used to identify editions, series, or TV seasons as use of this field forces an item-level hold in Encore.

M-Message (pop-up):

- An m-Message is required to identify the components of a multi-part-item. E.g. "check for three disks" or "check for map." A list of components should also appear on the item.
- An m-Message is required if the item must be returned by patron directly to owning library.

2. Periodical Module in Sierra:

Discussion about installing the periodical module. Generally, the committee was in favor of installing this module.

3. Patron Record Entry

Discussion about clarifying the language to recognize that not every patron uses a physical library card. Also to strengthen the language requiring libraries in MHLS to issue library accounts to patrons residing in the MHLS service area.

4. **Hotspots:**

Eleven libraries have hotspots. Committee recommends that we create an i-type for this resource.

5. **Fines free i-type:** Libraries wishing to become partially fines free, limiting fines free to certain collections, require a set of fines free itypes. The committee agreed that this was a good use of the itype

To include in DA Business Meeting Agenda Attachment as an Action Item:

Action item #1

- Title: Update patron record entry in Resource Sharing Standards
- Background: Current policy indicates the conditions for creation of a patron’s library card.
- Issue: Not all patrons have a physical card, and some libraries have turned away patrons meeting the requirements for obtaining a library account.
- Recommendation: Update the language in the policy to reflect that not all library users have a physical card. Change “library card” to “patron account” and strengthen language requiring libraries in the MHLS system to issue library accounts to patrons residing in the MHLS service area. Updated entry:

System Residents: A ~~library card~~ **patron account**, for use in all Mid-Hudson Library System member libraries, ~~is issued~~ **shall be issued** created free of charge at all Mid-Hudson libraries ~~to~~ for anyone meeting the following criteria:

- a. A resident* of any city, town, or municipality within the Mid-Hudson Library System Service area**
- And**
- b. Does not already have a Patron Record in the Sierra patron database

Non-Resident Patrons: Anyone not eligible for ~~a card~~ **an patron account** as a System Resident may be issued a non-resident ~~card~~ **patron account** by any MHLS library based on local policies, including fees and borrowing. The decision to honor non-resident ~~cards~~ **patron accounts** is at the discretion of the circulating library.

Action item #2

- Title: Fines free Itypes
- Background: We are experiencing a trend toward fines free libraries. Some libraries are interested in moving in that direction by making only some of their collection fines free. This is a different approach than applying fine free credentials to a patron. Currently we do not have itypes in place in Sierra to support this.
- Issue: We need to create a fines free version of circulating itypes similarly to what we had done with no-holds. This will allow libraries the ability to identify some items fined and others not e.g. “book-fine

free". A book that exists in the adult collection might be fined while a book that exists in the children's collection would be fine free.

- Recommendation: MHLS staff should create a full set of fine free itypes for regular circulating materials. MHLS will determine the itypes that would be needed and update the loan rule determiner table to support the circulation of these items system wide.

To include in DA Business Meeting Agenda Attachment as an Action Item:

Action item #3

- Title: Hotspot i-type
- Background: 11 libraries currently circulate hotspots, but there is no i-type for hotspots
- Issue: Libraries would like to create loan rules for hot spots that are unique from other itypes currently in place.
- Recommendation: Create a hotspot i-type
